To the teacher

The National Railway Museum invites you and your students to spend an enjoyable and educational experience at the museum. It is suggested that you allow approximately 90 to 120 minutes to make the visit effective.

Museum bookings

Admission fee - contact the museum. All teachers, parents and carers are free. Free train ride is included in the price of admission. Telephone (08) 8341 1690 for bookings or further information.

Facilities

Large covered outdoor eating area - tables and chairs. Drink and snack machines are located within the museum. Pass out tickets are also available. Provision for storage of school bags is available upon request.

Student numbers

The museum prefers a ratio of approximately one teacher/parent/carer for every 10 - 15 students. Teachers are responsible for their student's behaviour while at the museum.

About the pack

The pack is designed with special relevance to the growth of rail within the nation (Australian Studies) - in particular we have chosen the TransAustralia Railway and the Tea and Sugar train - (this train began as a service for rail workers on the line across the Nullarbor Plain, it later serviced outback communities along the route).

Early Years
