

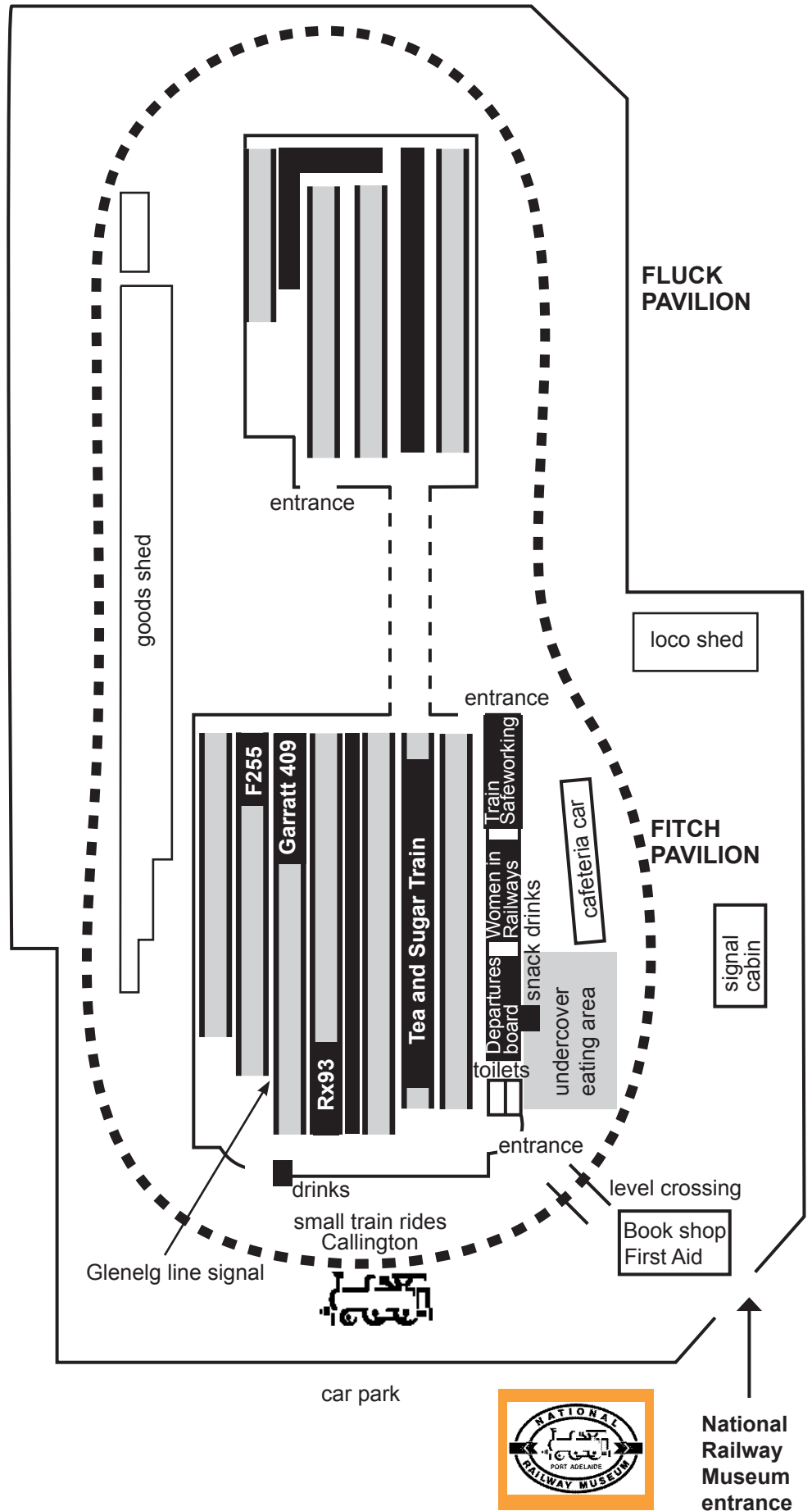

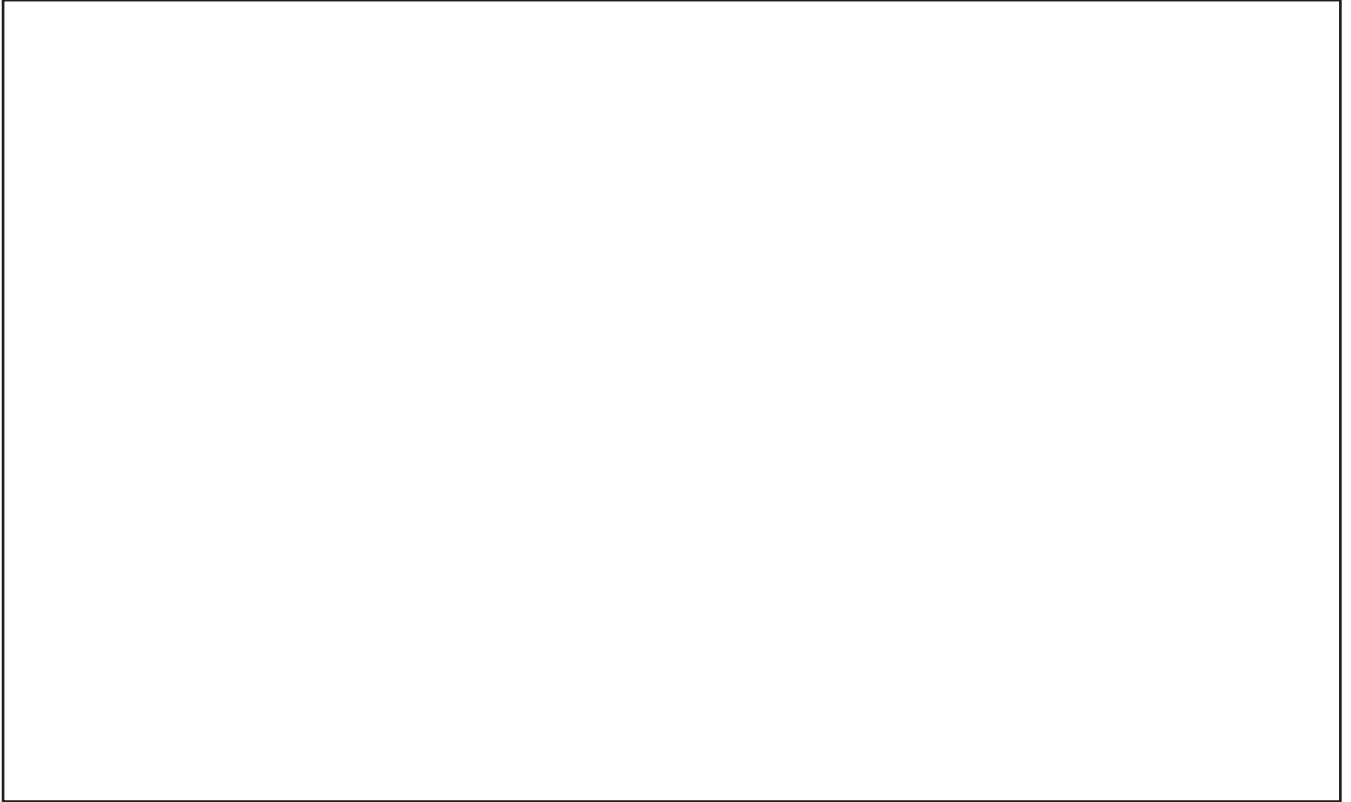
Note the map shows where the locomotives and carriages are situated in the museum, refer to the questions on the Worksheet

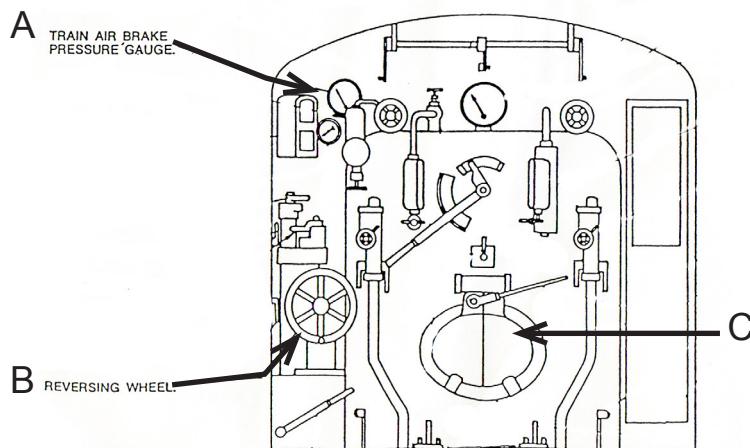

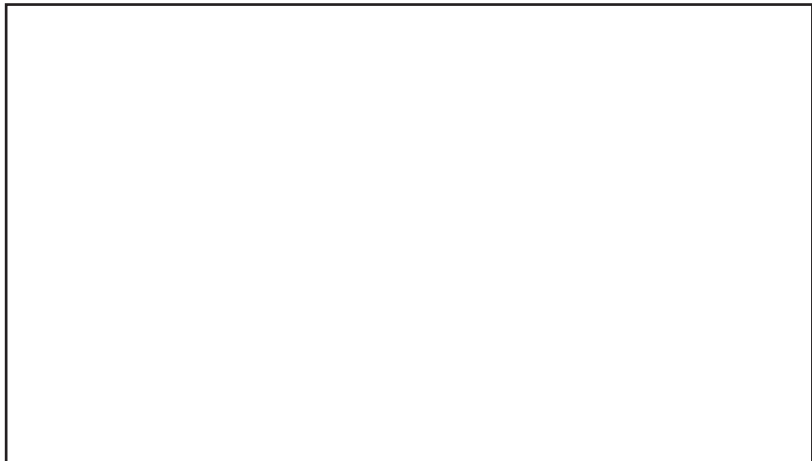
